
True and False Reform in the Church

Pope John XXIII read this book during his years as papal nuncio and asked, A reform of the church "is such a thing really possible?" A decade later as pope, he opened the 2nd Vatican Council by describing its goals in terms that reflected Congar's description of authentic reform: reform that penetrates to the heart of doctrine as a message of salvation for the whole of humanity, that retrieves the meaning of prophecy in a living church, and that is deeply rooted in history rather than superficially related to the apostolic tradition. Pope John called the council to update the church's capacity and to revitalize ecclesial life in all its unique local manifestations. Congar's masterpiece fills in the blanks of what we have been missing in our reception of the council and its call to "true reform."

神学院中文部新讲师介绍

从2021年7月开始,新加坡天主教神学院中文部非常荣幸地迎接了两位新的讲师.他们的加入,使神学院中文部的课程更上一层楼.这两位讲师分别是.

主徒会士张利勇神父: 张神父2005-2011年在新加坡圣方济沙勿略大修院修读神哲学。2012年8月20日晋铎,之后在天主圣三堂牧灵三年.张神父于2015年6月赴罗马深造并于2018年6月在宗座额我略大学完成圣经神学硕士,并于2021年3月19日取得额我略大学圣经神学博士学位.张神父专攻保禄书信,但其所学范围涵盖新、旧约释经和神学.



张神父2021年第二学期讲授了神学证书课程中的基础学科(圣经导论),2022年第一学期即将讲授神学文凭和高级文凭课程的学科(创世纪/默示录).这些学科带领教友们直接碰触天主圣言、严谨释经、默思圣经中的神学教导及益灵信息.



神学院奖学金得主,曾到台湾辅仁圣博敏神学院深造的陈定贤老师: 陈定贤老师2015-2018年在新加坡神学院以优异的成绩完成了神学证书以及神学文凭课程.2018年9月赴台湾继续深造,并于2021年6月于辅仁圣博敏神学院获得教义学学士学位,以及灵修学程证书.陈老师多年来在教委属下组织服务,并为教友们主办讲座、带领祈祷聚会及主持避静.

陈老师2021年第二学期讲授了(天主教灵修学),本学科属于神学证书的一门基础学科,也适于神学文凭及神学高级文凭的学员,同时也开放给教友们旁听.本学科从宏观上系统地鸟瞰天主教灵修的意义及传统,方法上采取理论与实践并重,目的是帮助学员更亲近天主,更爱天主,活出天主子女的生命;也希望学员们将学到的与人分享.

神学院中文部第二届“教理讲授”结业生特辑

新加坡天主教神学院自2018年开始,由副院长张思谦神父偕同几位讲师,为教友们开设了“教理讲授”普及课程,本课程以(天主教教理)为内容大纲,解析慕道过程中的各个环节,深入浅出地分享信仰与生活的方方面面,以期帮助学员反省与主相遇的经验,并鼓励众人喜乐传福音.
